RANDOM LAYOUT
Random layouts are commonly used when laying paving stones of various sizes that module together such as the five stone Granite, the five stone Leiden Collection (shown above) and La Pietra ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Quattro. Random layouts are not a pattern. They are literally any placement of the stones in any order.

Two simple tips to ensure that you are laying a true random layout are:
Never have four corners meet
Never have any joint running linearly for more than about nine feet


Stack Bond uses 100\% of any rectangular or square stone


Three stone running bond works with any stone that has three sizes it can module with. It uses $46 \%$ large rectangles, $31 \%$ squares and $23 \%$ small rectangles


Two stone running bond works with any stone that has three sizes it can module with. Typically, it uses $60 \%$ large rectangles and $40 \%$ squares. If you use squares and small rectangles, the ratio shifts to $60 \%$ squares and $40 \%$ small rectangles
